Dear Galt Families.

Hopefully we can now say that Spring has finally arrived. The arrival of spring means very busy times as we move forward in the final preparations for exams and end of year activities, as well as the preparations for the upcoming school year.

It has been another very busy year at Alexander Galt, with a wide range of activities provided both to & by our students. In addition to a strong ongoing athletics program, our students have had opportunities to participate in many field trips both near and far, benefitted from visits of guest speakers and performers, engaged in fabulous performances in both this year's Winter and Spring Productions, participated in a Talent Show, created Art Exhibits, provided Band performances, competed in Math, Writing, and Improv competitions, and who can forget the annual Carnival – with many more activities still to come. Further, we continue to take pride in the work performed by our WOTP students while out on stage in our communities. We receive a lot of positive feedback on our students' performance in the workplace and these students can be proud of their accomplishments.

In addition to all the activities, teachers and students are also busy covering and mastering course content. Please keep in mind that attendance is extra important at this time of the year. There are a number of examinations held in class starting as early as mid-May. In early May, you will be able to see the June examination schedule on our website. As Term 3 is worth 60% of your child's academic year, we have issued an Interim Report that gives you valuable feedback. Students requiring extra help are encouraged to seek help from their teacher, may have been referred to our resource team, or have been instructed to attend extra help sessions provided by teachers during the noon hour. Phelps Helps continues to offer after school tutoring for students living in the Stanstead area. Recently you should have also received information regarding FREE online tutoring through LEARN. If your child is absent at any point over the next few months, please make sure there is a follow-up with the teachers to ensure that your child receives all valuable exam prep material. If at any time you have questions, please contact your child's teacher or Vice-Principal. Please be reminded that for mandatory exams only justified absences (medical note, court appearance, death in the family) may be accepted. It is extremely important that you are aware of the exam schedule and that students are present for their exams.

For the upcoming school year, Alexander Galt continues to offer value added programs accessed through an application process. Students may choose to apply to one of our concentration programs - Visual Arts, Performing Arts, Science (Cycle 1), Sports, or new in the upcoming year, Hunting and Fishing (Cycle 2). Space is limited and it is advisable to apply early. If you wish to have more information about these programs and the associated fees, please contact our School Accountant, Mrs. Christina Rousseau or a Vice-Principal through the House Office. We are in the process of reviewing applications and conditional acceptance letters are being issued. If your child has not yet applied, it is still possible to submit an application in order to be considered for admission.

Students completed their course selections just after the March Break with the support of our school Guidance Counsellor, Marie Thibault. We ask that you take a few moments to verify your child's course selection by logging in to the secure Mozaik portal using the following link: https://inscription.portailparents.ca/. If you have questions or wish to request a modification to the course selection, please contact our school organization technician, Anna St-Hilaire at extension 22057. Students who did not complete their course selection despite the many requests and reminders have

been placed in classes. It is important to note that we will not be holding a "course change" period in the fall. Course changes will only be considered under exceptional circumstances and under the recommendation of the teacher(s) concerned and the Administration. It is imperative that course selection be taken very seriously as the school allocations are used to organize the school based on these selections. We will not be in a position to accommodate requests, particularly where a student did not complete the requested course selection despite all supports provided for this.

Be sure to reserve your foursome for this year's Ninth Annual Piper Classic fundraising golf tournament. This year's Piper Classic will take place at the Milby Golf Course on Saturday, June 22nd. FINAL EXAMINATIONS JUNE 11 - 21, 2019

Please note that June 7th will be the last day of regular classes for both Cycle 1 & Cycle 2 students. Students will then return to school according to their individual exam schedules.

Because the evaluation process is spread over a fairly lengthy period of time, tests and exams will also be written during the month of May. School attendance is vital to your child's success.

Timetables for end-of-year exams and final High School Leaving examinations will be distributed to students early in May. Please be sure that your child reads the timetable carefully. These examinations can be administered at one time only and if a student misses one due to careless reading of the timetable or forgetfulness, nothing can be done to remedy the situation until the next set of examinations are scheduled.

Attendance, Behaviour & Dress Guidelines

As the weather starts to get warmer, we would ask for your co-operation in ensuring that all students come to school dressed appropriately.
