Your child's final report will soon be available online via the student portal. Hard copies will be mailed to those families without email.

Credits for the purpose of certification are granted by the Ministry of Education for level 4 & 5 courses only. They will appear on the statement of marks sent directly by the ministry. As explained in prior communication, these results are also now available online via the Ministry. For level 4 & 5 students, please note that the official mark is that showing on the Ministry Releve, and not the school report card.

If your child has not returned all textbooks, library books, or has an outstanding account with the school, these amounts will show as debt in your child's account. You should receive an itemized invoice in mid to late July. We would ask that this account be settled by either returning the missing school material or by remitting to the school the amounts owed. Unpaid debts will be forwarded to bill collection.

Have you tried our online payments?

We are very pleased that since the summer of 2018 it has been possible to pay your School items' invoices with online banking through your banking services.

Currently, The National Bank, Desjardins, Scotia Bank, TD, Tangerine and BMO-Bank of Montreal customers can use this service. Other financial institutions may have been added or could be added in the future. You only have to add COMMISSION SCOLAIRE EASTERN TOWNSHIPS - SCHOOL ITEMS as a payee. You will need to fill the requested information along with the 20 digit number; being the "reference number" that you will find on the top of your invoice/statement of account, just above your name (payer's name). The number starts with 836. This number identifies both the student and the payer. This number will be the same, as long as your child goes to the same school. You will need to create a separate payee's invoice reference number to pay for each of your children (as they each have a unique ref. number). You will also need to enter a separate payee ref. number for each payer: if both parents pay an invoice, each of them has their own ref. number. (i.e. joint custody). It is therefore very important to use the accurate ref.

number. You can also pay at an ATM machine, by inserting the payment coupon with your payment. Please note that there is a delay of 2 to 3 working days to allow all data to be updated in our different software.

It is important to know that if your child changes school, you will need to update your payee's ref. number as they are specific for each school.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE BILLING FOR SCHOOL ITEMS IS DIFFERENT THAN THE ONE FOR DAYCARE SERVICES WHICH IS ALSO DIFFERENT THAN SCHOOL TAXES. THERE ARE 3 DIFFERENT REFERENCE NUMBERS, ASSOCIATED TO 3 DIFFERENT SUPPLIERS (1 SUPPLIER FOR THE DAYCARE, 1 SUPPLIER FOR SCHOOL ITEMS AND ONE FOR SCHOOL TAXES). IT IS MANDATORY TO HAVE THEM SEPARATE.

If you prefer to pay in person, you may do this until July 19th or after August 12th by presenting yourself to Central Office.

PROVINCIAL RESULTS FOR STUDENTS IN LEVELS 4 & 5

This is important information for all students who wrote secondary 4 and 5 exams in June. Please note that the ministry of education sends a statement of marks directly to students' homes towards the end of the second week of July. It should be noted that the mark on the ministry statement of marks is the final mark obtained by a student in a particular course. It takes into account the school year mark and the ministry exam mark. If the mark is below 60% then the student has not passed that course (even if the mark on the school report was a passing mark) and should therefore register for the summer supplemental exams.

CONCENTRATION PROGRAMS

All payments for students registered in a concentration program should have already been received by the school. If you have not made the required payment, please do so as soon as possible to guarantee your child's placement in their program. Incomplete registrations or inadequate payment will result in the student being assigned a schedule in the regular program in August.

SCHOOL FEE PAYMENT FOR THE 2019 – 2020 SCHOOL YEAR

Payment for school fees must be made in cash, Interac, VISA or Mastercard. We will not be accepting cheques as payment. Please note that there is a fee of 2% for all credit card transactions to cover the bank charges on the transaction. This year all required consumable materials will be issued to students in class and there will no longer be the extended fee collection period in August. To greater convenience our population who come from a wide territory, we encourage the use of the online payment services to avoid making a long drive and potentially long waits in the heat. For those preferring to pay in person, Ms. Rousseau will be available to receive you from August 19th – 22nd and August 26th from 9 a.m. – 4 p.m., as well as August 23rd from 1 – 4 p.m. Parents of Secondary 1 students may pay their fees in person following the Orientation visit on August 27th, from 1 – 4 p.m.

Students will be assigned lockers on their timetable that will be available on the portal. Unassigned lockers found with locks will have the lock removed and replacement costs will not be compensated by the school.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION UNIFORMS

Students from levels 1 to 5 will have to wear the compulsory gym uniform. In most cases, students who were already at Galt will still have their uniform and as such will not have to purchase a new one. Students who have to purchase part or all of the uniform can expect to pay approximately:

Galt T-shirt \$10.25 Galt Nylon Mesh Shorts (Saxon) \$13.50

Students who prefer to wear sweat pants instead of shorts will be able to purchase these from the school at a cost of \$18.50.

BUS TRANSPORTATION 2019 - 2020
