15+ PROGRAM OR PRE-VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM

Pre-vocational training program:

A 1-year program to prepare students to enter a vocational training program.

General education component: Secondary 3 English, French, Math, and Exploration of voc. studies

Choice of one of the following: Woodworking, Small Motors Mechanic or Skills for Living

OBJECTIVE OF PROGRAM

- To prepare students to enter (or complete) a vocational training program
- Help students obtain a first diploma
- Develop academic and professional goals
- Increase school success
- Decrease drop out

Who is it for?

- > Students who are 15 as of September 30th
- ➤ Has successfully met Secondary 2 competencies in Math, English and French (2 out of 3)
- > Is interested in pursuing a vocational trade
- > Interested in more hands-on work
- > Autonomous

2-4-U YEAR 1

Concomitance program: prepares students to obtain their prerequisites for their DVS. Must be 16 years of age as of September 30th and have obtained Secondary 3: English, Math, French

General education component:
Secondary 4 English, French, Math

Vocational training component:

60% of time completing their Diploma Vocational Studies

2-4-U YEAR 2

Concomitance program: prepares students to obtain their SSD and DVS. Must be 16 years of age as of September 30th and have obtained secondary 4 English, French and secondary 3 math

General education component: Secondary 5 English, French, Math (can be sec. 4) and 1 unit of adult education

Vocational training component: 60% of time completing their Diploma Vocational Studies

THE FUTURE OF SKILLED TRADES

- Skilled trades are hurting for workers, which is driving up wages in those jobs
- Stigma attached to trade believing that university is literally the only path to career success and happiness. Obviously, that is not true and never has been. But is it even less true now

- Wages are a common misconception. According to Statistics Canada, the average national salary is \$40,000 per year, while the average salary for a certified, skilled tradesperson is \$60,000. University graduates as a group may earn more that that is only because higher income profession like doctors, layers and engineers inflate the numbers. Exclude these and gap does not exist
- Furthermore, can earn \$ while in school and often graduate debt free
- One of the most important reason to consider skilled trades exciting opportunities: the training develop highly specialized knowledge and skills (math, science, physics are critical for many trades). All trade require daily use of critical thinking and problem solving
- You get to do what you're good at.
