



## AGRHS Parent Bulletin, May 2022

<u>June Programming</u>: June 10th will be the last day of regular classes for MAPs, Regular, and Concentrations Programs. (WOTP's regular schedule prescribed and scheduled through June 23rd) The period of June 13 - 23 will be organized as follows:

- Modified Programs: Programming confirmed by teacher(s)
- ARP/Flex & Sec. 1 3: Targeted Instruction and Reassessment (please see details & registration link)
- Sec. 4 & 5: Prep and Exams (schedule to be posted shortly)
- WOTP: Assigned Schedule

It is important to be aware that students are not permitted to roam during the June 13-23 period. When not in exams or classes, they must be in prep sessions, an organized activity, or designated study location. Students in Sec. 4 & 5 are permitted to leave after their exam if they do not have other mandatory activities in the schedule - however, it is important to understand that students who leave during the day prior to dismissal are not permitted to take the school bus at the end of the day.

<u>Exams</u>: Please note that attendance remains critical throughout the final weeks of school. Through the month of May students will be engaging in various formative and summative assessments, including Uniform government exams in English and French. Authorized absences are restricted to Covid (Dr's note not required) or other illness (with Dr's note), death in the family, court appearance.

Cafeteria Services: Please note that cafeteria services will be available until June 23rd.

<u>Graduation/Prom</u>: We will once again return to the Delta Hotel in Sherbrooke to celebrate the graduation of our students. In the interest of health & safety, we will operate this event at a slightly reduced capacity. Each graduate will be permitted to purchase up to 4 guest tickets and staff attendance will be restricted to those volunteering to assist with the event. The event will once again be live streamed in order to permit family and friends to join virtually.

<u>Yearbook Pre-Sale</u>: Please note that the pre-sale of yearbooks' deadline is fast approaching on May 18th and the cost is \$45 or, if purchased after May 18, \$50. Payment is required in cash or from the student's fundraising account (forms available from Ms. Montgomery in Student Activities). Order forms are available outside of the Student Activities Office. There is a limited number of books available - so 1st come, 1st served:)

<u>Consumable Fees</u>: A reminder that full payment of school fees is now past due. We will be moving forward with a collection agency in the coming weeks. Therefore I encourage you to verify the status of your child's account and to please complete all outstanding payments. A reminder that individual student fundraising accounts may be utilized for school fees.

<u>Piper Classic</u>: We are happy to announce that the Piper Classic will return as an in-person fundraising golf tournament this year, with all proceeds going to the AGRHS Athletics Program. <u>Covid 19</u>: As of May 14th masks are no longer required in most public places, including schools. While not mandatory, individuals may continue to wear masks if they wish and we will continue to provide masks for school use to any student wishing to have them. Please remember that government directives may still change frequently. The most accurate source of information is always directly through the <u>government website</u>.

## Important details to remember:

- As always even prior to the pandemic, students who are sick need to stay home.
- Students who become ill during the day will be sent home. It is expected and appreciated that they are picked up in a timely manner.
- With the exception of Library Bistro reservations, as well as groups whose classrooms are not safe for eating (ie. science lab; gymnasium...) who have assigned group tables in the cafeteria, students are only permitted to eat in their classroom. Lunch is eaten in the Block 2 classroom while snacks are eaten in the Block 1 and Block 3 classrooms. Breakfast to go is eaten in the Academic Block classroom. Eating is also permitted outside during recess and lunch and everyone is reminded to use the garbage pails.
- Upon arrival at school, students are to go directly to their AB/Block 1 classroom after making a brief stop at their locker to secure their belongings & collect what is needed for their morning class.
- Water fountains are not in service, students should have a refillable bottle that they can fill from the bottle fillers (on the fountains).
- Vending machines are removed from service pending further notice.
- Students should always be prepared for the possibility of online classes in the event of unavoidable "bris de service", or to access their google classrooms in the event they are unable to come to school. Chromebooks must always be in good working order, and issues need to be brought to the help desk promptly. The Chromebook should be brought back and forth between home and school daily.
