

## **AGRHS Parent Bulletin - February 2023**

**Staff Appreciation Week**: This week marks the 29th year that Quebec has recognized an annual week to celebrate the commitment and powerful work of teachers. We are extremely fortunate at AGRHS to have an incredibly strong and diversely talented team of educators devoted to the growth and success of our students. They deserve to be celebrated every day but this week we highlight this appreciation of our teachers, as well as our entire staff, who collaborate with the best interest of our AGRHS students and community in mind.

Course selection for 2023 - 2024: A reminder that, as indicated in the January Bulletin, the course selection period for returning students and grade 6 students coming to Galt next year will take place February 13th to February 24th. Registration is required prior to course selection (students who have not re-registered will not be able to access course selection). Information pertaining to the diverse pathways of our AGRHS programs can be found on the school website via the AGRHS Pathways page. As course selection is completed in class with the support of our Guidance Counsellor, we ask parents to verify the course selection on the parent portal. If you have any questions or concerns with your child's selection, it is important to communicate with the school as soon as possible as there is no course change period once schedules have been completed. We encourage parents to actively discuss course selection with their child(ren) prior to the selection period, such that the choices made best reflect your decisions as a family. Please note that each student's course selection form reflects the choices made at registration and the pathway of their tentative placement. All final placements are subject to final review of June and summer supplemental results.

**Early Dismissal/Pick Up:** Please note that if your child requires an early dismissal and/or will be picked up rather than taking their usual transportation home, you must notify the school via the House Office directly in writing. A text message to your child is unfortunately not adequate as we require the parent's signature. If you are picking up your child after school, please arrive no later than 3:50pm as there is no supervision after this time, and students are not able to wait inside. If students are not picked up by 3:55pm, they will be sent home on their bus. Thank you for your cooperation.

**After School Tutoring:** The second round of registrations for after school tutoring sessions is currently underway. Parents should have already received the registration form via email, and you have until February 10th to sign up your child(ren). **Tutoring Registration Form**
