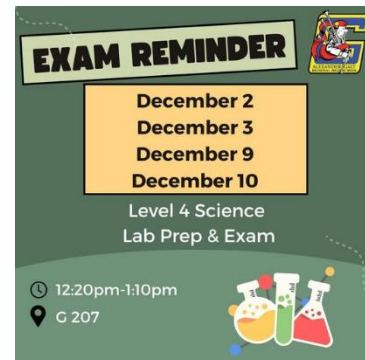

- A 14-15 year-old can consent to sexual activity with a person up to 5 years older.
 - A 12-13 year-old can consent to sexual activity with a person up to 2 years older.
 - The age of consent to sexual activity in a group (more than 2) is 16 years old.
- Under 16, even if the person is willing, it's automatically a criminal offense.
