You can be issued a ticket by the City of Sherbrooke if you have « *Disturbed the peace by fighting, wrestling, or otherwise using violence in a public place* » This includes the school premises, and it could mean a hefty fine of **\$181** even if all participants were willing. Remember that there could also be criminal charges.
